Attendance and Extended Leave

Overall attendance this half-term is <u>95.30%</u>, below our <u>96%</u> target. <u>60</u> children achieved 100% attendance this half term, a big well done to them! * This is a huge achievement, thank you for your ongoing support.

We understand that at times children are unwell and cannot attend school. However, if this becomes a regular pattern, the class teacher and Miss Farooq will meet with parents to support and actively encourage better attendance at school. Home visits will also be carried out if necessary.

Much of the school absence has been because of extended leave. **All trips abroad must be planned in the school holidays.** The school must be informed if any school days will be missed and a fine could be issued. Missing school does impact on children's overall learning and progress and can have a lasting negative impact into the future.

Parental support is crucial to ensure children attend school on time, every day and reach their full potential.

We are committed to ensuring every child has the best chance to succeed—and that starts with strong attendance. High attendance reduces lost learning and helps children feel confident, connected, and ready to thrive.

Requesting Leave

In line with our school policy, **all leave of absence requests must be made in advance**, before booking any holidays. A leave request form is available from the school office. Please note: families who have previously received fines for unauthorised absences—whether at our school or another—may face prosecution if further unauthorised leave is taken.

Punctuality Matters Too

Classroom doors close promptly at **8:50am**. Any arrivals after this time must report to the school office, where a **late mark** will be recorded. Persistent lateness is followed up by a member of the **Senior Leadership or Safeguarding Team**, as it can significantly disrupt learning and routines.

Attendance Rewards

This year, we're excited to launch a whole-school attendance initiative!

- Pupils achieving **97% attendance or above** by the end of the academic year will be invited on a **free reward trip**.
- Those with **100% attendance** will continue to receive a **voucher** and may also win a **family pass to Tenpin Bowling (Dewsbury)**.

A Gentle Reminder About Late Collection Fees

We'd like to kindly remind families about our late collection fee policy. To support smooth end-of-day transitions and ensure staff are not delayed or forced to work overtime, the following charges apply:

- £2 for collection between 3.25pm and 3.30pm
- £5 for collection after 3.30pm

We understand that occasional delays happen, and we appreciate your efforts to collect children promptly. If you were unaware of this policy, especially as a Reception parent, please do speak to the office team for clarification.
