What the Children will be learning

This term our topics include: Super Me, Superheroes, Dinosaurs, Unicorns, Into the woods and Celebrations including; Diwali and Christmas. We follow the children's interests as we observe and assess them which in turn may mean some of our planned activities may change.

In EYFS there are 7 areas of learning and development (indoors & outdoors) so your child will be outside and inside every day. Please ensure they have a waterproof coat and extra layer (cardigan or jumper) even on warm days as it can turn chilly. Please note, even if your child has brought a puddle suit into school, they will also need a normal coat for playtimes.

PE

PE kits need to be in school for the whole of the term. We will have PE on **Wednesday mornings** and **Friday afternoons**. Please ensure all items of clothing are clearly labelled to avoid them becoming misplaced.

It would be helpful if you could support your child in learning how to dress and undress in order to speed up this process in class.

Reading and Phonics

Developing a love of reading during a child's early learning is so important. Please share books with your child every day. At this stage, talking about the pictures in the book, how characters may feel and what may happen next is important. This helps children build on the necessary comprehension skills needed to become an independent reader. Children can also spot familiar letters such as those from their name whilst sharing books at home.

In a few weeks we will have learnt our first set of sounds and the children will be able to bring home reading books! The children will also bring home flashcards for the first set of sounds. Please use these cards to practice the sounds daily, you can also make up words with the sound and play games (we will send ideas to support this nearer the time). The children are going to be provided with a login for an online library, where they can access e-books to support phonics. Once the children are ready we will share this login with you and details about how to access the different resources.

Tapestry

Thank you to everyone who completed their Tapestry agreement. If you have still not completed your form, please do this as soon as possible so we can begin uploading activities for your child's learning journey. It would be appreciated if you could upload observations of your child and their achievements at home. These could be things such as; swimming, riding a bike, baking etc. We then share these moments in the class and the children enjoy talking about and celebrating their successes with their friends.

Water bottles / Snack

Please can we remind you that it is important that your child has a water bottle in school every day so they can have access to water throughout the day.

Children are provided with a snack each day, so do not need to bring their own and sometimes the children will be offered milk.

Communication from school

We know that starting school is a busy time and there are lots of new systems to get used to. Our main method of communication is via *School Spider*. School spider can be downloaded as an app onto smartphones where you will receive smartphone messages. It is important to make sure you are signed up to the system so you receive letters and other information. If you are unsure as to whether you are signed up please call into the office and they can make sure we have all the relevant information. Thank you for your support so far.
