Our Topic this Half Term is 'Me and My Community'.

In the Me and My Community topic, your child will learn about the school community and building friendships. They will explore the school grounds and find out about the people in school who are there to help them. They will explore how they are special and unique and how everyone's family is different. They will take part in practical activities to support them to build new friendships and explore what makes a good friend. They will also find out about people in the community who help us, including doctors, nurses and the emergency services.

Supporting your child at home:

- Look at family photographs together and discuss who is part of your family and extended family.
- Look at baby photographs and talk about how they have grown up.
- Look at childhood photographs of parents and grandparents.
- Talk about the things you like to do together and places you like to go.


This half term in **Maths**, we will be learning:

General Reminders:

Head lice:

Please check your child's hair for head lice every week and treat if necessary.

School uniform

Please ensure children are wearing the correct school uniform and shoes. Wellies and overalls for wet weather may be brought in a named bag which the children will hang on their pegs. All uniform MUST be labelled.

PΕ

Children can bring their PE kit into school in a named bag and left on their peg. We will have dedicated indoor PE sessions every Tuesday.

Book bags:

Children may bring a small rucksack that can be hung on their beg with spare clothes should they have an accident during the day. Toys are NOT allowed in their bags and will run the risk of being damaged or lost. Children are expected to bring a book bag (or plastic folder) with their reading book and reading diary every day. Reading:

Please read with your child every day and write their progress in their reading diary. Your child's book will be changed every Friday.

Water Bottles:

Please send your child with a named water bottle each day. The bottle must contain water only.

Snacks and packed lunches.

Please DO NOT send your child with a snack. The children have access to a healthy piece of fruit during the day.

As we are a healthy school, we encourage children to eat a healthy balanced diet.

Please DO NOT send children with anything that contains NUTS due to severe allergies in school. This includes Nutella.

Chocolate, fizzy drinks and sweets are not allowed in lunch boxes.
