Dear Parents/carers

We hope the following information will prove useful in order to heighten your awareness of what is taught and when it happens during the Summer term. The key elements for each subject are on the back of this sheet so you are aware of the main units of study and can support your child in their learning.

- Swimming for Class 9 is on a **Friday** and will continue until the end of the year.
- Up until Spring Bank half term P.E will be on a **Wednesday**. Children need to wear plain PE kits and trainers.
- The children will also have dance lessons on a **Friday this half term**, and will need to wear plain indoor P.E kit.
- **After Spring Bank half term** P.E will be on a **Monday** and the children will need outdoor P.E kit.
- Homework is usually given each **Friday** and it is expected that it will be completed by the following **Thursday**.

Each week your child will be expected to practise and extend the following literacy and numeracy skills:

- **Reading** – we suggest 10 minutes per night and to include a variety of fiction and non-fiction. Please encourage your child to look at the features of different texts.
- **Multiplication tables** – The children all have their own tables target to work on, this is tested each week. Please build on the work your child is doing in school. The children should complete the assessment on Purple Mash.
- **Spellings** – Spellings will be taught in school with supporting homework sheets and sometimes a spelling list. This will include spellings within the rule being taught, but also spellings that have been identified as a target for your child. These will be tested weekly as a dictation rather than a traditional test of a list of words.

In addition to these activities your child may be asked to bring in relevant items for a particular topic, to carry out some research or to investigate a problem.

Each child has a folder in where they will place the homework sheet each week. On this sheet will be specific spellings to learn, other homework and important reminders/dates. Please use our email addresses if you need to contact us.
