Good Attendance Is The Key To Good Progress

Please can we remind all parents of the importance of reporting a child's absence.

You can leave a message on School Spider, ring the office: 01925 623640 or text: 07415 869045 if your child will not be attending nursery. Make sure your contact details are up to date. **We discourage you taking holidays during term time as it is very disruptive to your child's progress.** We aim for 97% attendance which equates to just 6 days absence over the year. Obviously this might be taken up with illness so holiday absence on top of this may hinder your child's progress. If time out of school is unavoidable then please ask for and complete an ABSENCE REQUEST form from the office.

School will close on Friday 13th February, and re-open on Monday 23rd February.

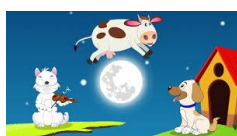
TERMLY PAYMENTS:



We would like to make families aware that this charge doesn't cover the schools costs but is a contribution towards your child's snack and little extras like their birthday and Christmas gift and last term the Christmas Elf Show. Without your donations we simply would not be able to offer such treats to your children. Payments are due by the end of the first week of each term, or half term. Some families choose to pay for the full school year, most pay termly but you also have the option to pay half termly. **We ask for £16 per term for children attending 15 hours and £32 for those who attend for 30 hours. Please make this payment via the School Spider App.**

We hope you are all enjoying viewing the photos and observations of learning staff share on Tapestry each week. We love to read parent/carers comments on these posts and the images you share of your child's home learning. The information you provide helps staff to learn more about your child's interests and engagement in learning at home.

Home Learning—Staff also post a range of **weekly home learning activities** on Tapestry. As partners in your child's learning and development **it is important that you support your child to complete these activities**, many of which will enable them to gain extra practice and link experiences they have had in nursery. Please log in to Tapestry regularly throughout each week to ensure you keep up to date with these home learning challenges. If you have any questions about home learning or are having difficulty accessing Tapestry please speak to your child's key worker

Early Maths—Did You Know?



The early years curriculum for maths is split into 2 aspects 'Number' and 'Numerical Patterns'. As well as exploring our maths home learning bags, parents and carers can help children's mathematical development in these aspects through a range of everyday activities.

YOUNGER CHILDREN Number—counting toys in the bath, how many spoons or plates needed when setting the table, counting steps taken on the stairs, singing number songs and rhymes, showing amounts on fingers e.g. 2 fingers to show you are 2. Numerical Patterns— make collections of things that are the same, grouping things by colour, size, shape, filling and emptying bottles in the bath, making themselves small/ stretching tall, ordering toys by size, making groups of the same amount e.g. 3 for you and 3 for me, helping to put shopping away, what's heavy and what is light

3-4 YEAR OLDS Number— singing number rhymes counting forwards and backwards, practice recognising small amounts up to 3 without needing to count them, playing dice games and counting the spots, making marks to represent numbers e.g. number 3 or 3 lines to show we need 3 bananas on a shopping list, playing simple bingo games Numerical Patterns— making and comparing groups with 'more' or 'fewer', hiding toys and using words like 'on top of', 'behind', 'next to', looking for shapes on a walk to school, using scales when backing or a measuring tape to measure the height of a tower
