Your child's current teacher has given your child's new teacher lots of useful information.


### KS1 Curriculum

There are three classes in Key Stage One. There is a Year 1 class, a Year 1/2 mixed class and a Year 2 class. Children are taught by their class teacher for all subjects.

In Key Stage 1 we carry on the active learning ethos the children have experienced in EYFS. Your child will learn in lots of different ways through direct teaching, small group work, independent tasks and learning jobs. Learning jobs build on the continuous provision style learning they have been used to in EYFS but have a focus on the learning intentions linked to curriculum areas.

All children are given the opportunity to access a broad and balanced curriculum, and subjects will include daily Maths and English lessons, and the afternoons are mostly taken up with the foundation subjects such as...Science, Computing, RE, History, Geography, PE, Art, Design and Technology, Music and PSHE.

All children will need a PE kit in school from the start of term.


We will continue to follow Little Wandle Phonics in KS1.



House Points, Class Recognition Boards, Postcards home, Headteachers weekly celebration assembly.




# Attendance and Punctuality

### First Aid and Medicines

It is the responsibility of parents to inform school of any medication children take, e.g. inhalers. The inhalers will be kept in a safe place in KS1 where they will always be accessible to first aiders and the appropriate children. A form at the office must be completed for the use of inhalers.

Please inform us of any allergies that your child may have.

Antibiotics can be stored in the school office and administered by the staff. Again, parental permission will be needed.

If your child has a bump to the head, you will be contacted immediately. All first aid is dealt with by a trained first aider and bump notes are sent home explaining the incident and treatment given. When children have had a bump to the head, they will come home wearing a green wrist band.
