After half term we will be starting our 'show and tell' sessions. Please bring in a family photo or email a photo to the school office with a note to forward to Mr Kennedy for show and tell.


Tip: Talk to your child the night before or in the morning (if you have time) about their 'show and tell' item. It will help them for when they want to talk about it in school to their class peers.

We have been learning how to recognise our name and write it down using purposeful marks. You can find your child's name card in their bookbag. Please use this at home to help your child to recognise their name and write it.




