Welcome and gathering

Welcome all the children to One Voice.

Can they remember the five ways to wellbeing?



Introduce theme:

"Today we are thinking about forgiveness"

Forgiveness means letting go of being mad or hurt when someone does something wrong and choosing to be kind instead. 🧡

Thought/story/scripture

Share this Bible verse with the children

Ephesians 4:32 – "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."

Read the story of The Prodigal Son (Luke 15) – forgiveness brings people back together.

What does it feel like when someone forgives us?

How can forgiving others and make our hearts lighter?

Reflection

Ask children to sit quietly for a few seconds and think about the reflection question

"Have you ever had to forgive someone? How did it make you feel?"

Allow them some time to add a response to the question, keep these for the reflection area and revisit them during reflection time on Friday.

Short prayer

Dear God, thank You for loving me. Please help me to say sorry when I do wrong, and help me forgive others, just like You forgive me. Amen.

Biology is the **study of living things** — that means all the plants, animals, and even tiny creatures you can't see without a microscope!

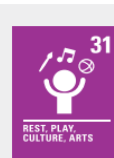
It helps us understand:
