Reflection questions

- 2- How can you show love through your words or actions?

Allow them some time to add a response to the question, keep these for the reflection area and revisit them during reflection time on Friday.

UN Rights of the Child

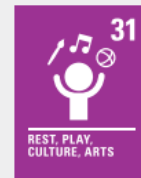
