When the leaders saw Daniel praying, they told the king. The king was sad because he knew Daniel was a good man, but the law had to be followed. Daniel was put into a den full of hungry lions.

That night, God sent an angel to shut the lions' mouths. The lions did not hurt Daniel at all! The next morning, the king was so happy to see Daniel alive. He knew God had protected Daniel because Daniel had done what was right.

The king then made a new rule that was fair. He told everyone to respect Daniel's God and to do what is right.
