They are nothing to worry about and they will take place during some of next week's morning lessons. The results of these tests will be discussed with you during parents evening.

#### **Healthy Snacks**

#### **Autumn Disco**

Thursday 23<sup>rd</sup> October will see the school host our first school discos in a while. Children in the EYFS will enjoy their disco in the afternoon during the school day (the EYFS team will send out a separate letter about this event), but all other groups will enjoy their disco after school. Children in Years 1, 2 and 3 can return to school for 4:00pm – 5:00pm for their disco and children in Years 4, 5 and 6 can return to school at 5:15 – 6:15pm for their disco. Due to the time of year, if children would like to come to the disco in fancy dress, they may do so or they can simply wear their own clothes. Tickets are on sale via School Spider priced at £3.50 and this will include entry to the disco, a drink, a snack and glow sticks.

#### A Final reminder about Courageous Advocates

As part of our collective worship programme, we look to give the children an opportunity each half-term to speak up about an issue that they feel passionate about. They can prepare what they want to say at home and then tell the rest of the school about it during our courageous advocates worship. They can do this either in a small group or by themselves. We are always really impressed by what they have to say and the passion they show for the issues that they are talking about. Our first courageous advocates worship is on **16**<sup>th</sup> **October**. If any child wants to talk part they should speak to their class teacher or Mrs Walker about it.

On the final day of the half term, we will be hosting a non-uniform day in school. Lucy in Year 5 has been to see me to ask if we can raise some funds towards dyslexia- friendly books in school, which I think is a wonderful idea! #### **Collective Worship Theme – Justice**

We have continued to look at how justice prevails and how God can guide us in our decision making. This week we read the story of Jonah and how he disobeyed God's instructions. We reminded ourselves about the difference between equality and equity and how sometimes it is not about everyone getting the same as it is more important that everyone gets what they need. In our Thoughtful Books this week, the children discussed how they can support someone if they have made the wrong like choice — like Jonah did in our Bible story. The children, as always, had wonderful ideas such as setting the right example, explaining why something is wrong so tat they understand and supporting someone to own up if they have done something wrong and standing by their side. Our Y6 worship leaders were fantastic as always in presenting these ideas to the rest of the school.

#### **Home Worship Books**

As always, we had lots of children bringing in their home worship books to share in school this week. It was lovely to see so many children bringing their books to share with everyone. There were thoughts on lots of different subjects including littering, friendship, The Wardley Way and the Christian value of Justice that we
