We have enjoyed another busy week in school.

Our Nursery children have been exploring the story of *The Three Little Pigs* and creating their own junk model houses. In Reception, pupils have been consolidating their understanding of one more and one less than a given number, alongside making Nancy's clay pots. Year 1 have been developing their artistic skills by painting using stencils, while Year 2 have been producing artwork inspired by Kandinsky. In Year 3, pupils have been working towards writing non-chronological reports and have also created postcards for *Beat the Street*, sharing their favourite places to walk in Salford. Year 4 have been learning about the digestive system and the roles of different types of teeth. Year 5 have been investigating the effects of friction as part of their Forces unit, and Year 6 have begun their new history topic focusing on the Windrush generation.

As always, it has been a real pleasure to pop into lessons and see what everyone is learning.

Maths at Wardley

We use Maths No Problem to support our teaching of mathematics. The children are well-versed in this scheme and show a clear understanding of the format and learning principles within it.

The children regularly revise previous learning in their maths starters and this can be times tables practice, naming 2d shapes, reading co-ordinates, ordering numbers, place value or interpreting graphs. These maths starters help the children to retain and revise prior knowledge whilst building on their existing learning.

I regularly pop into maths lessons throughout the whole school and I am always really impressed with the level of concentration and positive attitude the children have towards their learning in mathematics.

Out of School Achievement

We actively encourage any child from Year 1 – Year 6 to bring in awards from outside of school. During our Celebration Collective Worship on Fridays, we allocate time for any child in Year 1 – 6 to come to the front of the hall to share their achievements. It is a lovely section of our time together and everyone enjoys seeing the trophies, certificates, medals and badges that are regularly brought in. If your child achieves anything outside of school, please send it in with them on a Friday so we can celebrate together.

Courageous Advocacy

Here at Wardley we are always happy to discuss matters which are important to the children and to hear their voices. Our Courageous Advocacy gives children the opportunity to stand up in front of the school to talk about matters which are important to them. We have had children talk about pollution, littering, slavery, protecting animals, anti-bullying, politics and war...and many other issues.

These sessions are a wonderful opportunity for children to speak publicly and we have been astounded by the courage and determination of pupils in the past.

If your child would like to speak about a matter close to their heart, our next Courageous Advocacy session is this week on **Wednesday 21st January**. We look forward to hearing what issues matter most to our pupils.
