We have had another busy week in school with lots of learning and laughter.

Our lovely Nursery children have been learning about spring and painting bright daffodils. The **Reception** children have been developing their maths skills by exploring doubling numbers.

In **Year 1**, pupils have been learning about animals and what their diets tell us, identifying herbivores, carnivores and omnivores. In **Year 2** the children have been comparing the cities of Nairobi and London in their Geography lessons. In **Year 3**, the children carried out a fantastic science experiment investigating resistance, testing toy cars on a variety of surfaces and in **Year 4** have been focusing on their writing by creating diary entries.

In **Year 5**, pupils have been developing sewing skills in D&T, practising running stitch and locking stitch and in **Year 6** have been applying their design skills by creating their own lunar rover designs and considering which materials would be most suitable.

International Day of Mathematics

What an exciting event we held this morning with our Pi Challenge. We had 36 children from our junior classes competing (and one child from Y2!)– all trying to recite as many digits from Pi as possible. Our winner this year was Alexis in Y6 who correctly recited Pi to 75 places! She was rewarded with a special Pi certificate and a mathematics set for her wonderful effort. Jeevan in Y4 and Megan in Y3 also received a maths set for achieving second and third place.

The children enjoyed special creative maths lessons this morning where they looked at this year's theme: Mathematics & Hope.
