Liquid:

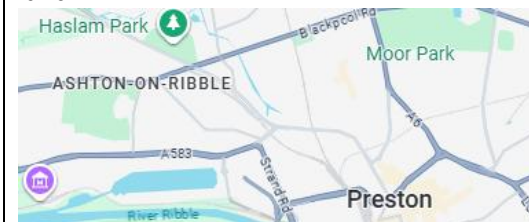
Gas

We will be looking at loads of maps to understand the city, the local area and the different uses of land.

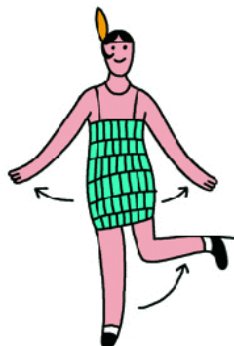


Can you draw a map showing your route to school, or your route to some other local place?
