

Year 6 Curriculum Information

ENGLISH

For this half term the main focus will be on grammar and reading in preparation for the upcoming SATs. We will be revising areas already covered and picking up questions that children find challenging.

For writing, we will be completing several pieces of writing covering a range of genres and incorporating the correct grammar and organisational features into them.

MATHS

In maths, we will be completing our learning on percentages before moving onto ratio and angles. We will be consolidating and revising prior learning in preparation for our SATS. We will continue to complete daily arithmetic questions to build on our speed and fluency in answering questions. Alongside these topics, we will be working daily on improving speed and accuracy in our times tables.

If your child is still not confident with their times tables, it would be great if they could practise at home..

CURRICULUM

History – This term we are learning about the Tudors and the impact this period in history had on modern Britain and religion.

PE – PE this term will be athletics. Children need to come to school in their PE kits on a **Monday**.

PSHE – In PSHE we will be looking at Life in the Wider World and, in particular, money. We will explore different ways we can make money and how to spend it wisely.

R.E – Following the question we have been looking at all year of, 'In what way is life like a journey?' the children will be looking at Christianity and addressing the question: If life is like a journey, what's the destination?

Science – In Science, we will be exploring the heart and the circulatory system where we will develop knowledge of their importance in the function of a human body.

Computing - In computing we will be exploring data bases and looking at how they work.

Design Technology – In DT we will be looking at structures and how we can design and construct a structure that is strong enough to use for our chosen purpose

It is really important that children read regularly at home. Although children must read their school reading book, they are also encouraged to read for pleasure by choosing books that are of interest to them. This can include non-fiction books, magazines, comics and newspapers as well as fictional stories.
