School Dinner Prices Increase

We received notification yesterday, that unfortunately, school dinner prices will rise from 1st April 2026. The current price of a school dinner is £2.95. The new price of a school dinner will be £3.07. The increase is due to continuing food cost inflation at 4%, increases in the National Living Wage and employer's national insurance contributions across the supply chain.

Parking

Attendance and Punctuality

Well done to everyone who has achieved their Gold and Silver Attendance Awards today. This is something that everyone in the family should feel very proud of and is not easily achieved. Attendance this half term has been 96.7% (which is really good!), and higher than national (94.9%) and local authority (95.4%) averages for the same time period. Year 1 and Year 2 had the highest attendance for this half term of 97.7% which is amazing!

Punctuality for the majority of children this half term has been excellent, however some pupils are consistently late. School starts at 8.45am and the children should arrive for 8.40am when the classroom doors open. Being late causes anxiety and stress for children; it means they may miss out on key information they need for the day; miss the chance to socialise with their friends before the start of the day and miss chunks of their learning. Please can all families ensure their children arrive on time next half term. if you are having any difficulties with your child's attendance and punctuality, please contact school so we can make sure we take the supportive approach that will best suit you and your family.

All holidays should be booked outside of term time. Good attendance at school is essential if children are to make the most of their education. All absences for holiday will be unauthorised (unless in exceptional circumstances) and may lead to a fixed penalty notice being issued.
