Safer Eating

To keep our youngest children safe at snack and mealtimes, we follow the recommendations set out in Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) health and safety guidance and NHS choking-prevention advice. These guidelines highlight that certain foods present a higher choking risk for young children and must be avoided or prepared safely. Round foods such as grapes, cherry tomatoes and blueberries should always be cut lengthways into quarters, and hard items like raw carrots or apples should be cut into thin strips. Sausages should be sliced lengthways rather than into rounds, and foods such as nuts, popcorn and whole grapes should not be brought into school at all. Please ensure that any food sent in lunch boxes is prepared accordingly before coming into school. Thank you for helping us follow Early Years best practice and keeping every child safe at mealtimes.

School Uniform Change

Our school uniform policy is inclusive, flexible and allows choice. Jewellery and nail varnish are not part of our school uniform. Trainers should only be worn on PE days. When children have a genuine difficulty with aspects of the uniform policy we work with families to find sensible compromises to support them.

Governors have agreed that from January, PE kit will now include the option of wearing a dark blue, plain, round neck t-shirt. This can have a school logo, but does not have to.

Please contact Mrs Nicholas our Family Support Worker, through the school office, if you would like to discuss school uniform. We always have free school uniform available for those families who need it.

School Places for Reception September 2026

The closing date to apply for a September 2026 Reception school place is 15th January 2026. Parents of children who attend our school Nursery will need to apply for a school place. All applications should be made online through the local authority [CWAC School Admissions](#)

Attendance and Punctuality

Good attendance and punctuality at school supports a child to achieve their full potential, boosts confidence, improves enjoyment of learning and a pupil's relationships with their peers. A child must attend school every day that they are required to do so unless an exceptional circumstance applies and holidays should not be taken in term time. Our school policies promote good attendance and punctuality, which are recognised and rewarded as achievements.

Our school's attendance for this term is 95.0%, a slight decrease on this time last year. However, unauthorised absences in the same period have reduced by half, which is very positive. Congratulations to all the children who achieved the Gold and Silver Attendance Awards today. Thank you to all our families for making an effort to improve their child's attendance and punctuality.
