Your child should spend 10 minutes daily on Hit the Button.

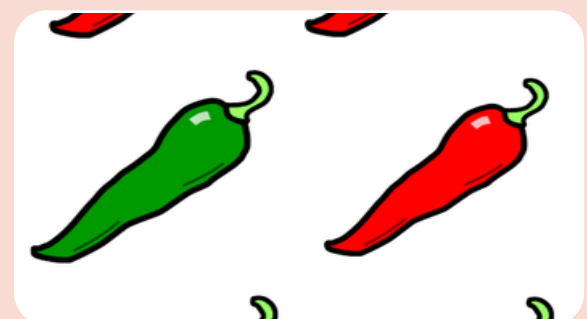
This can be accessed on any device and no login is required. The children should practice number bonds initially, then 2x, 5x tables

Your child should be regularly practising speedy green words and red words.













RWI reading books are given out on Wednesday and discussed on Friday.
