

10 tips when reading



#### Reading doesn't just happen



- Learning to read is an amazing process that is so natural you probably won't even remember learning how to do it. "I just could!"
- However . . . The reality of learning to read is very different.
  Done successfully we experience the first bullet point above.
- The hard work already started when you read books with your child when they were a baby. Reading becomes a natural experience because they are familiar with how books work.

#### How will my child learn to read?

First, your child will learn to read:

- Set 1 Speed Sounds: these are sounds written with one letter:
  m a s d t i n p g o c k u b f e l h r j v
  y w z x and sounds written with two letters
  (your child will call these 'special friends'): sh th ch
  qu ng nk ck
- Words containing these sounds, by sound-blending,
  e.g. m—a—t mat, c—a—t cat, g—o—t got, f—i—sh fish,
