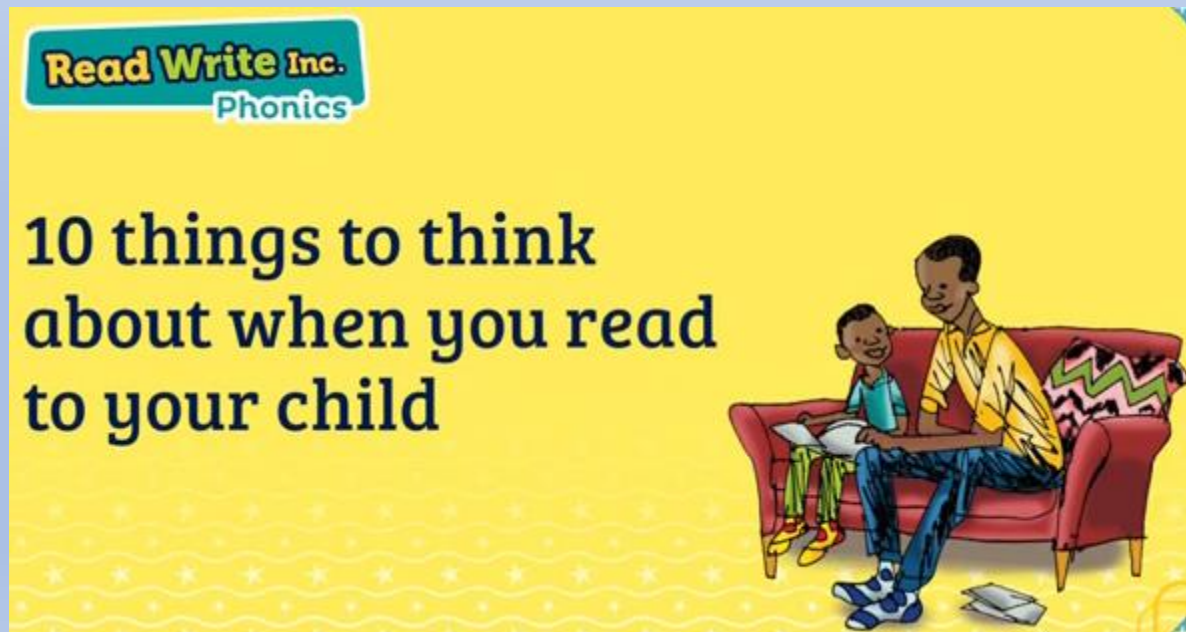

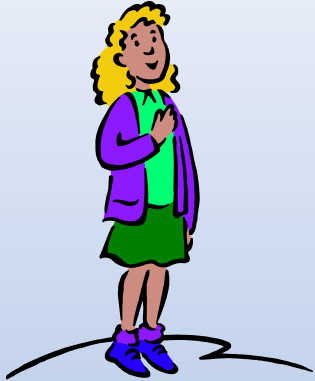


Reading doesn't just happen

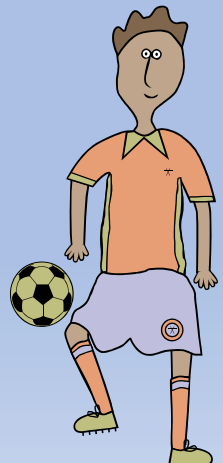


- Learning to read is an amazing process that is so natural – you probably won't even remember learning how to do it. “I just could!”

- The hard work already started when you read books with your child when they were a baby. Reading becomes a natural experience because they are familiar with how books work.

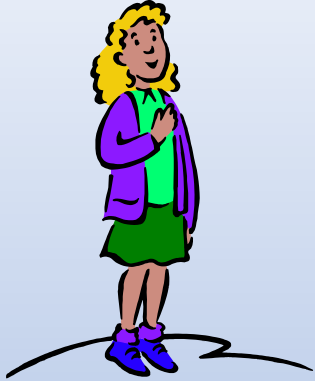

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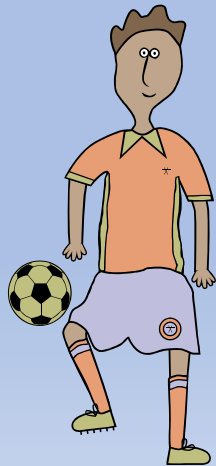

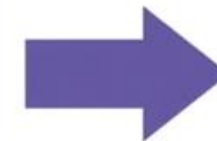

How will my child learn to read?

First, your child will learn to read:

- Set 1 Speed Sounds: these are sounds written with one letter:

m a s d t i n p g o c k u b f e l h r j v

y w z x and sounds written with two letters

(your child will call these 'special friends'): **sh th ch**

qu ng nk ck

- Words containing these sounds, by sound-blending,
e.g. m-a-t *mat*, c-a-t *cat*, g-o-t *got*, f-i-sh *fish*,

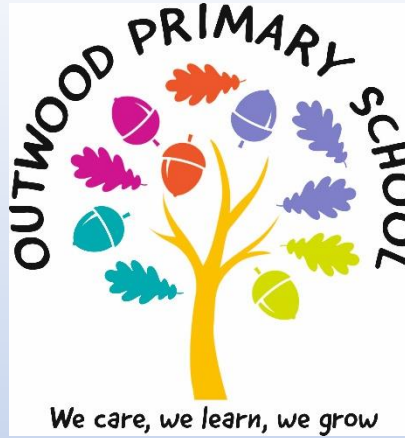
