




<p>Write a newspaper report about an important Iron Age discovery. You can set it in modern times (maybe an archeological dig) or in the Iron Age (maybe you have just discovered iron)</p>	<p>The Ancient Civilisations were the first to use writing but they looked very different to ours! Can you create your own alphabet?</p>	<p>Do your bit for the environment! You could help with the recycling, maybe upcycle your old clothes or even come up with a plan that we could do at Outwood!</p>
<p>Create an imaginative story about the three different pre-historic using pictures to create a comic book style story.</p>	<p>Why not take your toys on a global adventure? Imagine what it would be like to like in the amazon rainforest or in southern Spain? What about the frozen artic or the beaches of Australia? Using your outdoor space, lots of different natural resources and your amazing imagination, take your toys on the adventure of a lifetime!</p> <p>(Handy hints for parents... Ideally, as this is screen-free time the children are best doing research from books if they want to be accurate. However, it is fine to let their imagination run free!</p> 	<p>Read a book that has your favourite character in it. Can you write a new adventure for the character?</p>
<p>Read a newspaper or magazine article. Can you summarise the article in your own words?</p>	<p>Watch an episode of Newsround. Write a script and film your own episode – you could do a modern version or imagine you are reporting from the past!</p>	<p>Take care of your well-being! Have some relaxing time and follow these videos to create some origami! You can start with a fox and build up to other things</p> <p><a href="#">How To Fold An Easy Origami Fox</a></p>
<p>Create a quiz all about the stone age, bronze age and iron age. Think of 10 questions and then challenge a friend to answer them.</p>	<p>Eggy crest heads Next time you use an egg for cooking, or eating, instead of throwing the shell away use it to plant seeds inside. You will need to wash and dry your empty eggshell. You can keep it in the egg box or use an egg cup as a holder to stop it falling over. The next step is to decorate your eggshell with a face. Maybe draw the face of someone you know, or a famous person. Wet some cotton wool and place it inside the eggshell. Sprinkle over your seeds all over the cotton wool. Leave to grow. Make sure your cotton wool stays damp. Your egg face will soon have a head of cress hair!</p>	<p>Take part in the RSPB Big Garden Bird Watch! The egg shells can be quite delicate so are sometimes tricky to decorate. Stuff them with kitchen paper first and that can offer some support. It needs removing afterwards.

- Egg shell
- Egg box or egg cup
- Pens and/or other craft items to decorate
- Seeds- cress, or grass, seeds work well as
- they are fast growing.
- Cotton wool
