English

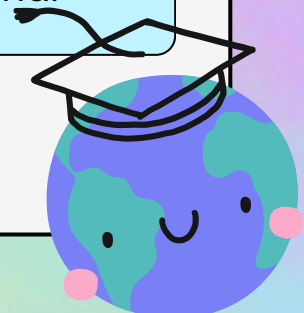
