Please complete the non-negotiables and **at least** one other task by **Monday 13th October.**

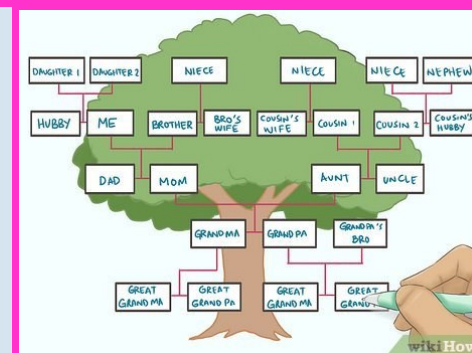
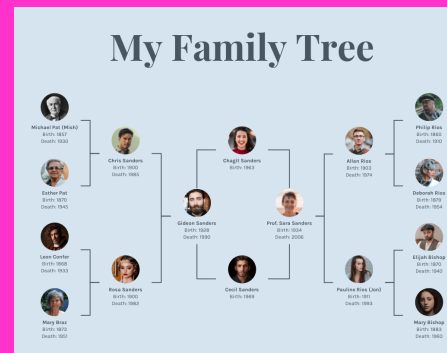
They can be brought in as and when they are completed.
