
<u> Year 2 at Beaver Road</u>

Teaching Assistants in Year 2

We have a team of highly experienced Teaching Assistants working across Year 2. They will be supporting children with their learning both in class and in small group interventions. The support of our Teaching Assistants will enhance the learning experience for children in Year 2.





All Year 2 classrooms are designed to give children the opportunity to learn by exploring exciting learning environments which help deepen their understanding of concepts taught in class. Common areas in all classrooms include Reading Areas, Investigation Areas, Maths/Writing Areas and Creative Areas. All classrooms also include calming areas with Zones of Regulation to help children regulate their emotions and practise mindfulness activities. Children's Rights and the Global Goals for Sustainable Development are embedded in all areas of the classrooms with class charters designed and made by the children at the beginning of the year.

English Curriculum

Our English curriculum is underpinned by a strong emphasis on the importance of reading in order to build the foundations for children's understanding of all areas of learning and the wider world.

It is essential for children to read daily, both at school and at home as this will allow children to become more fluent and independent readers. Creating a reading environment and routine at home will be incredibly important in ensuring children's success in Year 2. If you would like tips and information about how to do this, we are happy to help and answer any queries you may have.

With the building blocks of language enhanced by reading, children's own writing will also start to flourish. We encourage parents to support English development at home by practising the weekly spelling rules shared by teachers. In addition to this, there is also a key emphasis on letter formation and handwriting. We will be teaching handwriting formation and joins in class regularly and practising these at home will complement children's classroom learning.



Please support children with basic number skills at home by regularly practising counting, doubling, number-bonds, multiplication facts and telling the time.

It is extremely important for children to read for at least 10 minutes a day at home to improve their reading fluency. Children will be sent a reading book which they can change when they finish the book.

Please also ensure that children practise the Year 1&2 Common Exception Word list.






Seesaw is used regularly for both home learning and class use. Children will be given opportunities to share learning from the week on Seesaw for parents to engage with via Family Seesaw.

Changes to our School Uniform from September 2023

We are incorporating our school logo onto our current uniform.	Our new PE kit is a black t-shirt with black shorts, skort or leggings.	
Bookbags with the new logo are compulsory from Nursery to Year 2	Our providers are MCS Stores, Didsbury and Monkhouse Cheadle.	

New items:

Black showerproof windbreaker with a retractable hood (optional).

Bookbag with the new logo (compulsory for year groups nursery to year 2).

Backpacks with the new logo (optional).

Our main uniform:

Gold polo.

Royal blue cardigan, sweatshirt or fleece.

Charcoal trousers, skirt, pinafore or shorts.

Blue or yellow gingham dress in the warmer weather.

Black shoes or trainers.

Important note: There is no expectation for parents to buy this new logoed uniform if a current uniform still fits or you have bought the current uniform in readiness for September. Both uniforms are welcome in school until the older uniform naturally phases out.

We have made a bigger change to our PE kit. We wanted something comfortable, durable and a kit could stay looking fresh throughout the year. This new kit is compulsory from September 2023. The new PE kit is a black t-shirt and black shorts, skort or leggings. PE items with our logo will be available from both our suppliers, plain black items without the logo can also be worn – Please note: general sportswear will not be accepted as kit and a full black kit must be worn for all lessons from September.
