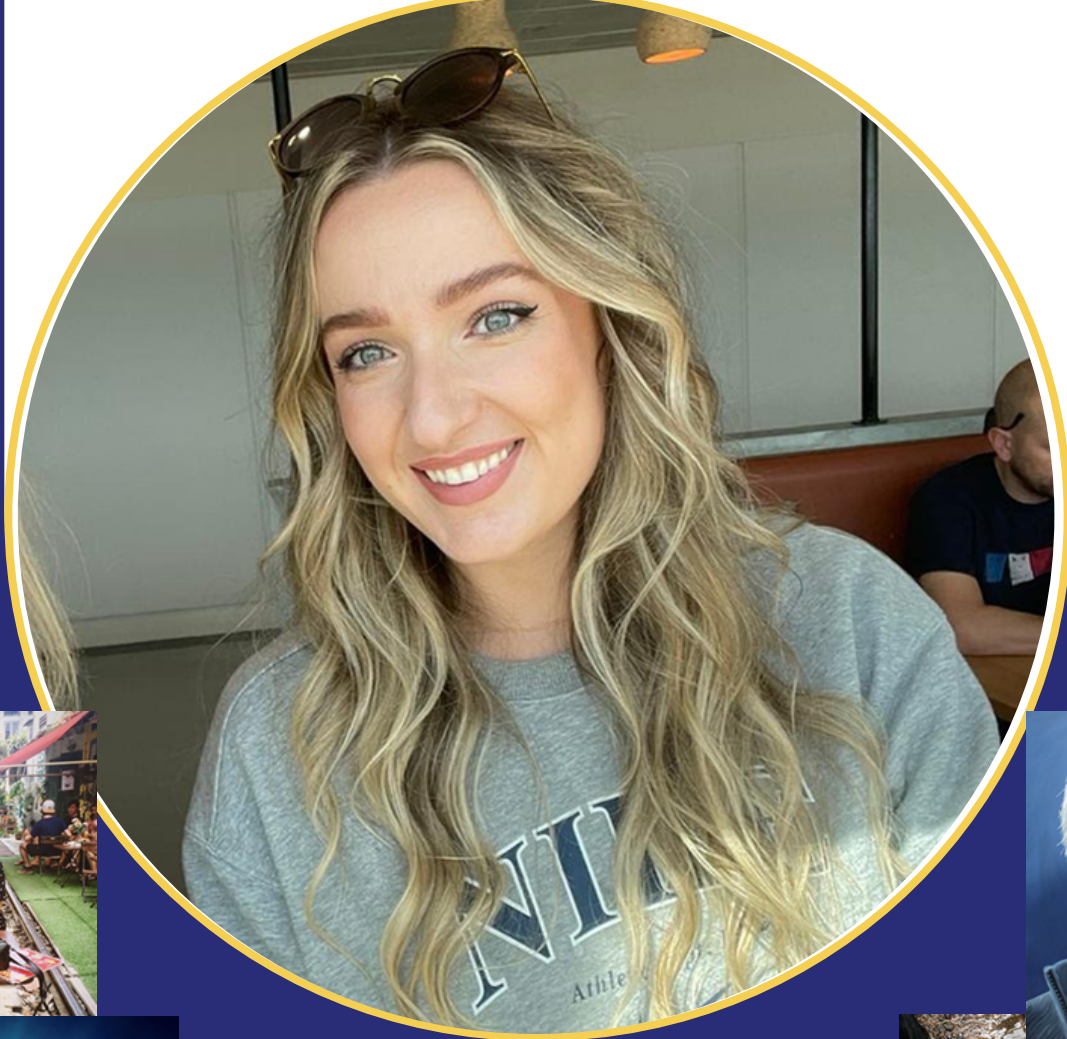

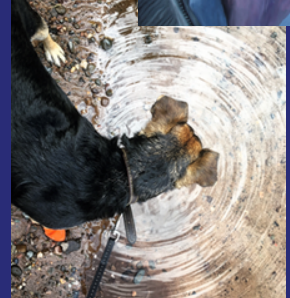

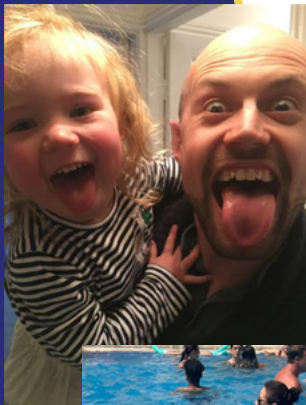


MISS BROSTER



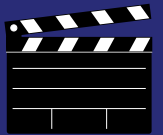
Hi everyone! I'm Miss Broster, or you can call me Miss B. I can't wait to teach year 6 again this year- it is by far my favourite!

HOW CAN YOU SUPPORT YOUR CHILD AT HOME?

Every Thursday, there will be a spelling check in class. It is also important that your child reads at home and uploads this to Seesaw. 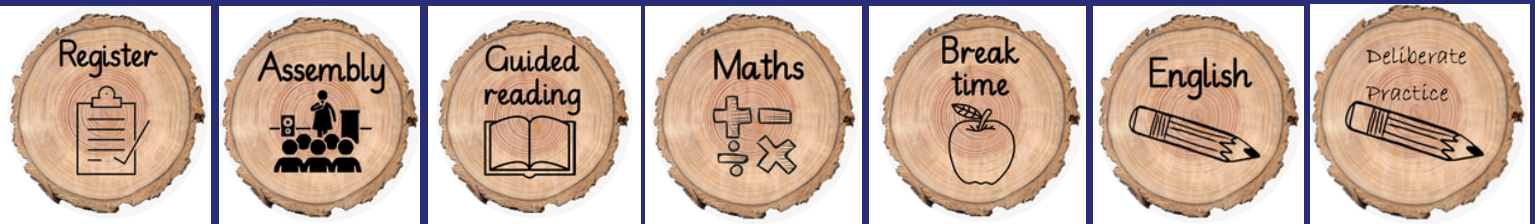


A TYPICAL DAY IN YEAR 6

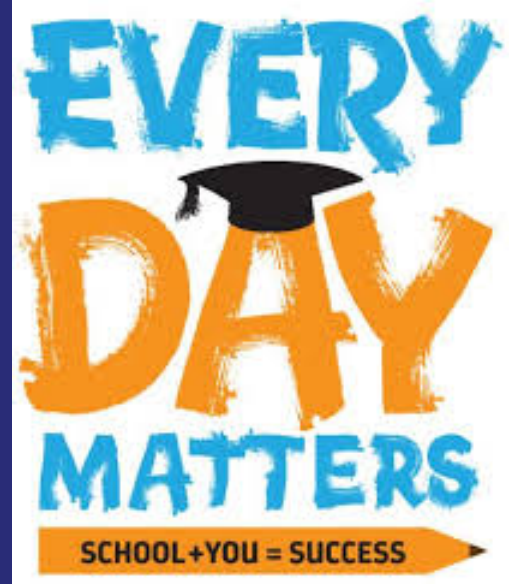

SCHOOL UNIFORM

- No jewellery (apart from small studs, which must be covered for PE)
- Plain black PE kits
