under Endowed Schools Acts.*



CHARITY COMMISSION.

In the Matter of the School Charity founded by
RICHARD CUMBERBACH, and his Wife, at
LOWER PEOVER, otherwise NETHER

WORTH, in the County of CHESTER, regulated
by a Scheme made under the Endowed Schools
Acts on the 6th August 1874, as altered by a
Scheme of the Charity Commissioners of the 8th
January 1879; and

And it appearing that the endowments of the Charity consist of the particulars mentioned in the Schedule to the subjoined Scheme :

And after due notice of the intention to make this Order published according to the direction of the Board by being affixed to or near a principal outer door of the Church of St. Oswald and of the Cumberbach School, both at Lower Peover, in each case on the 15th September 1893, and by advertisement in the "Knutsford and Northwich Advertiser" newspaper on the 22nd September 1893, and in the "Northwich Guardian" newspaper on the 23rd September 1893 (being in each case more than one calendar month previously to the date hereof) ; and also sent through the Post to those of the Governors of the Charity who did not join in the said application, at their respective last known places of abode in Great Britain or Ireland on the 27th April 1894, to

And after due consideration of all objections made to the proposed Order and suggestions for the variation thereof :

Do hereby Order as follows, viz. :—

The subjoined Scheme is approved and established as a Scheme for the further alteration of the above-mentioned Scheme of the 6th August 1874.

SCHEME.

1. The following words are hereby added to Clause 3 of the Scheme of the 6th August 1874 :—

Any such Owner of Tabley House may by writing under his hand duly notified to the Governors delegate his office as Governor to any fit person for any specified term of five years or more determinable with the life of such owner.

2. So much of the Scheme of the 6th August 1874 as relates to the approval by the Charity Commissioners of appointments of Coöptative Governors is repealed. Coöptative Governors.

3. The Governors may set apart and let in allotments in the manner prescribed by and subject to the provisions of the Allotments Extension Act, 1882, any portions of the land belonging to the Trust, other than buildings and the appurtenances of buildings. Allotments Extension Act, 1882.

4. The old school buildings belonging to the Trust, and any accumulations of income of the Trust may be used and applied by the Governors in and towards the provision of accommodation for technical or industrial instruction. Technical or Industrial instruction.

5. The Scheme of the 8th January 1879 is repealed, and Clause 26 of the Scheme of the 6th August 1874 shall in future be read as follows :—

26. The Governors shall, subject to any legal claims which may be due, apply the yearly sum of 30%, part of the income of the residue of this endowment, in the advancement of the education of boys and girls in one or more of the following ways :— Application of income.

- (a.) Providing an Exhibition or Exhibitions tenable at some place of higher education, to be awarded on the ground of merit ;
- (b.) Providing for pupil teachers, on the termination of their engagement, with a satisfactory report from Her Majesty's Inspector of Schools, prizes or Exhibitions tenable in training colleges for teachers ;
- (c.) Payments to the Principal Teacher for instruction given by him in subjects higher than those recognised by the regulations of the Education Department in force for the time being according to the Standards therein prescribed as the ordinary subjects of Elementary Education, no such payment being at the rate of more than 1% in any one year for each scholar so instructed ;
- (d.) Providing aids to technical and industrial Instruction.

Subject as aforesaid, such residue may be applied by the Governors towards providing salaries for the teachers of the School of the Trust, and for other purposes connected exclusively with such School.
