Spring 2	Year 6
<p>English</p>	<p>In English this half-term, we will be using 'The Day War Came' by Nicola Davies as our core text. Children will explore themes of resilience, empathy and belonging. They will engage in a range of writing tasks including diary entries, descriptive narratives and persuasive letters focusing on using emotive language and varied sentence structures.</p> <p>We will continue to consolidate and building on the children's spelling, punctuation and grammar skills throughout our lessons each week.</p>
<p>Maths</p>	<p>Decimals, fractions and percentages. This half-term, children will be learning about decimal place, adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing decimals. Children will also be learning how to find percentages of numbers. They will be converting decimals to fractions and continuing to work on adding and multiplying fractions</p>
<p>Science</p>	<p>Animals, including humans Children will learn about the human circulatory system, including the heart, blood vessels, and blood. They will explore the impact of diet, exercise, drugs, and lifestyle on the body. Additionally, they will understand how nutrients and water are transported within animals, including humans.</p>
<p>History</p>	<p>This half-term, our history topic will be continuing with 'What was it like in Britain during WW'?</p>
<p>Art</p>	<p>Painting inspired by Van Gogh's Starry Night. This half-term children, will explore Van Gogh as an artist thinking about what inspired his style. Children will explore many of his paintings thinking about the movement he created in each painting. They will explore colour, style, feelings to create a similar style painting.</p>
<p>Computing</p>	<p>Data and information - Introduction to Spreadsheets This half-term, children will learn how to use spreadsheets to organise and analyse data. They will enter and format information, use simple formulas to perform calculations, and create charts and graphs to present their findings. By the end of the unit, they will use their knowledge to use spreadsheets to manage budgets and resources.</p>
<p>PSHE</p>	<p>Rights and Respect This half-term, Year 6 will explore important themes around rights, responsibilities, and decision-making. They will consider different perspectives in conflict situations, learn how to stay safe and respectful online, and discuss the value of work and money. We will also explore how shopping choices impact the environment and how democracy works in Britain, including elections and the law-making process. Some lessons will</p>

	involve optional projects, such as community art and developing a persuasive pitch.
PE	Tuesday – Gymnastics Wednesday - OAA
RE	Christianity - <i>Why do Christians believe Good Friday was good?</i> Children will explore the significance of Good Friday in the Easter story. They will learn about Christian beliefs surrounding Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection, considering why this day is seen as a moment of sacrifice, love, and hope rather than just sadness. Through discussions, Bible passages, and reflections on Christian teachings, children will develop their understanding of how Easter is celebrated and why it remains central to Christian faith today.
Music	Gaining Confidence Through Performance – How does music improve our world? In this unit children will learn and perform songs including Disco fever, La Bamba and Change.
French	Time and school timetables Children will learn to tell the time in French and understand school timetables. They will practice saying the hours and minutes, using both 12-hour and 24-hour formats. Additionally, they will learn vocabulary related to school subjects and daily routines, enabling them to describe their school day and discuss their schedules in French
Homework & Spellings	For homework , your child is expected to read their reading book regularly , practise their spellings and complete their weekly maths homework . This is due in on a Thursday . Spellings will be sent home in your child's home learning book, on a Friday, and tested the following Friday in school. We also encourage children to use Times Tables Rock Stars to support their maths learning. Our whole school core value challenge this half-term focuses on: Curiosity and cooperation .
