



Stubbins Primary School Curriculum Planner

Summer 2	Year 4
English	This half term, Year 4 will be reading <i>Blue John</i> by Berlie Doherty. The children will explore themes linked to the Iron Age and the geography of the UK before writing their own letters. They will continue to develop their reading comprehension, grammar and vocabulary skills through engaging texts and discussion.
Maths	In Maths, children will learn about shape, statistics, position and direction. They will identify and classify different shapes, interpret data presented in charts and graphs, and use coordinates and directional language to describe movement and position.
Science	Our Science topic is Living Things and Their Habitats . Children will explore how living things can be grouped in a variety of ways and investigate classification systems. They will learn about different habitats and how environmental changes can affect living things.
History	This half term, children will investigate The Lancashire Cotton Industry , including its importance to the local area and its impact on communities. As part of our local Black History study, pupils will explore the contributions and experiences of people connected to this significant period in Lancashire's history.
Art	This half term, Year 4 will explore the exciting world of textiles. Children will investigate different fabrics, materials and techniques used by artists and designers. They will develop their sewing and joining skills, experiment with pattern and texture, and create their own textile artwork inspired by a range of sources.
Computing	In Computing, pupils will work on Repetition in Games . They will learn how repetition is used in programming and create simple game projects using loops and repeated instructions.
PSHE	In PSHE, the focus is Growing and Changing . Children will learn about personal development, managing change, and understanding how relationships and responsibilities develop as they grow older. Lessons will encourage confidence, resilience and self-awareness.
PE	This half term, pupils will take part in invasion games and net and wall games . They will develop teamwork, communication, tactical thinking and a range of sport-specific skills while enjoying active participation.
RE	In RE, children will study Christianity (Church) and explore what Christians mean by "love your neighbour." They will learn about key Christian beliefs, teachings and values, including examples from parables and the concept of Agape (selfless love).
Music	Our Music unit, The Show Must Go On! , will give children opportunities to perform, compose and develop their confidence as musicians. They will explore how music can be used to entertain and communicate with an audience.

Homework & Spellings

For homework, your child is expected to read their reading book regularly, practise their spellings and complete their weekly maths homework. This is due in on a Thursday. Spellings will be sent home in your child's home learning book, on a Friday, and tested the following Friday in school. There will also be a whole school core value challenge you can complete if you want to. We would love to see photos/ videos on class dojo! These will be celebrated at the end of the half-term.
