

"What makes me special?" Topic Home Learning Challenges (Reception AT1)




This term our topic is I am Special! I am ME!

Literacy

In school we will be reading the story, 'What makes me a Me?'



Can you retell your favourite story?
You can use the pictures as prompts.
Can you use a picture book and make up your own story?
Can you practice writing your name? - Remember a capital letter to start with. EG Harry.

Understanding the world (Who is special to me?)

Draw or create a picture of your family and the people who are most important to you.



Grown-ups can help you to label them.

Please bring them in and we can talk about them together at school.

Numeracy

Can you say your numbers to 10?




Can you spot any numbers when you are out and about?

Find some items of clothing around your house with different fastenings, and practice fastening them.

Or can you create your own small world? It could be a zoo, a farm, a dinosaur land. Be as imaginative as you can.


Can you change your voice for each character?
