

Literacy

During our 'Read me a story,' topic we will be reading and learning about lots of different stories and traditional tales. We will talk about and discuss each story in detail. The children will be encouraged to think about each of the different characters, their feelings and the events that are taking place in the story. Developing our comprehension skills and enriching our language. We will continue developing our phonics skills and learning more and more tricky words for reading and building up our sight vocabulary. We will continue to write in a range of contexts, writing different stories, writing facts, recipes, letters, and lists using our phonics skills to segment for writing in sentences.

Personal, social, and Emotional

We will build on the first terms work, our belief in ourselves, reinforcing respectful relationships with our friends, using vocabulary to express our feelings, how we can regulate our feelings and consider the feelings of others.

Thinking about the perspectives of others, taking turns, and looking after our toys and resources. Taking care of our property and playing appropriately with our friends. We will continue to work on our independence skills, getting dressed, going to the toilet, washing our hands, using a knife and fork, and taking care of ourselves.

Communication and Language

Over the half term we will develop our confidence to talk to a range of audiences, in small groups, whole class and at assembly time. We will continue to practise listening carefully in a wide range of situations and understand why listening is so important. We will learn lots of descriptive vocabulary to tie in with our topic and ask questions using How? What? When? Where? Who? Why? And will continue to ask questions to check and understand what has been said to us.

Maths

This term will continue developing our confidence and understanding of number. We will be counting to 10 and beyond, understanding one more than and one less than a given number, and look at the relationship between consecutive numbers. We will be developing our confidence with number to recall number bonds to 10 and start to count in 2's, 10's and 5's. The children will learn about and discuss 2D and 3D shapes, developing in confidence to name them and discuss their properties. We will continue throughout the half term to compare length, height, and time through a range

of fun activities.


