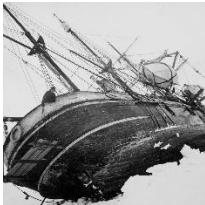
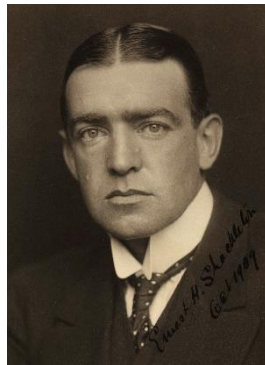
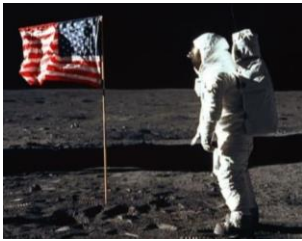

Sticky Knowledge About Exploration

Sir Ernest Henry Shackleton was born on 1874 and died in 1922.

Shackleton's crew was made of 26 men and 69 dogs. The ship was called Endurance.

Endurance became stuck on in the pack ice in the Weddell Sea and the men had to evacuate.

Endurance sank on 21st November 1915.

Shackleton was seen as a hero for his bravery and perseverance.

No member of the crew died during the expedition.

Neil Armstrong was the first human to walk on the moon during the **Apollo 11 mission** on 20th July 1969.

He completed the mission alongside co-pilots **Edwin E. "Buzz" Aldrin** and **Michael Collins**
