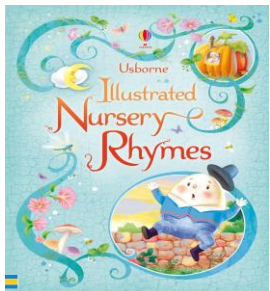
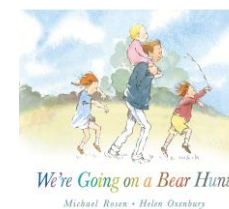
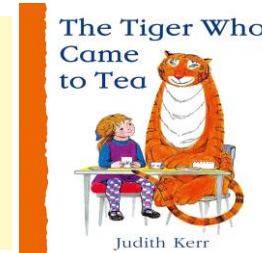
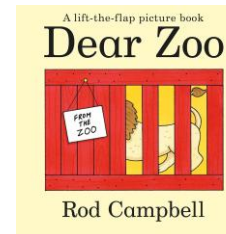
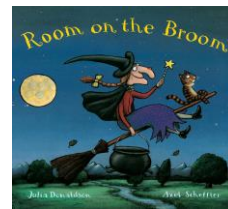
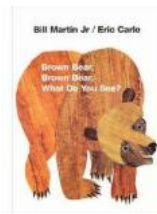
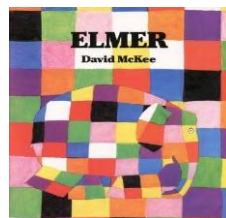
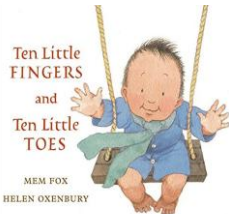
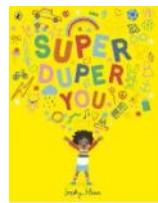
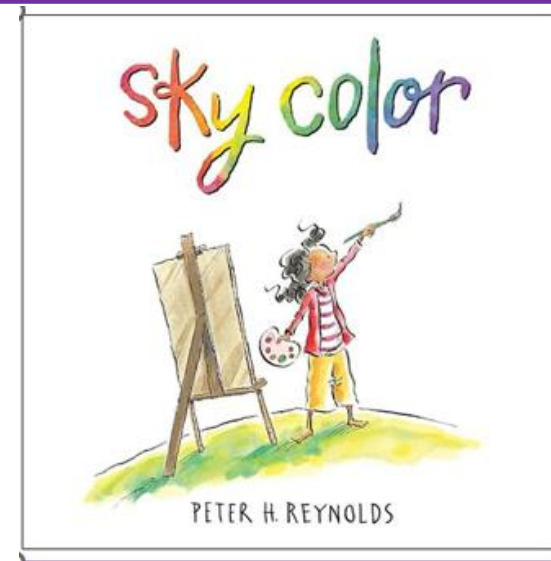


# Nursery INSPIRE Curriculum Newsletter – Autumn 1

# Nursery Curriculum Newsletter – Autumn 1



## Communication and Language

Whilst we settle into the new environment, we will work on developing our communication and language skills. We will model showing children how to communicate their wants and needs, we will learn key phrases such as, yes please and no thank you, can I play too, stop it I don't like it, I need some help. We will have whole group and small group circle speech and language activities to help us gain confidence in this area.



## Personal, Social and Emotional

Our focus this half-term is to settle the children into school life and to help them to feel happy, safe, and secure. Our main priority is that the children are happy and enjoy coming into school and have fun. We will work hard so that all the children develop a sense of belonging and feel that they are valued members of the class.



## Physical Development

Throughout the day, we will be developing our fine motor and gross motor skills. We will have dough discos (making shapes with playdough to music) and funky finger discos to get our finger muscles strong. Over the half term we will be spending lots of time in the outdoor learning area – becoming confident climbers, movers, and cyclists. We will be working hard to develop our spatial awareness and negotiation of space.



## Literacy

We will be sharing a range of different stories together; we will read traditional tales such as The Gingerbread man and modern stories such as Room On The Broom. Children can also look at books independently as and when they choose to in the reading area. We will bring our books to life with matching activities and games.



## Understanding the World

We will use photos of our own families and homes to build a small world area. We will look at the Hackwood community and where we live and ask who lives in my house? We will talk about and celebrate our differences. We will talk about the places we visit such as Tesco's, the Post Office, the local library and the park.



## Expressive Arts and Design

The children will have lots of opportunities to create and construct their very own masterpieces. The 'Creative Area' will be available for them to choose the resources they need; whether that be feathers, pom-poms, lollypop sticks or string. The children will be encouraged to find the materials and tools they need to create fantastic artwork which I am sure they will all love sharing with you.



## Maths

We will introduce numbers in fun ways such as counting steps, claps and items. Children will begin to recognise numbers 1-5 written and will count to 10 each day with support.
