

# Year 2 INSPIRE Curriculum Newsletter – Autumn 1



Our crucial curriculum content for this topic is:




- To know features of the countryside




We will be reading a variety of non-fiction texts linked to our topic to build our reading skills. We will also read fiction stories this half term such as 'Chicken Licken' by Mara Alperin and 'Farmer Duck' by Martin Waddell. In writing lessons, we will write a recount of our trip to Whitepost Farm and create our own narrative losing story using the book 'Farmer Clegg's Night Out' by Peter Bently. This introductory unit will build on foundational writing skills while introducing new concepts to help sentence construction, planning and organising ideas and expanding their vocabulary.

In Art lessons, we will research collages using natural materials. We will explore the work of the artist Andy Goldsworthy. We will then design, create and evaluate our very own collages using natural materials of farm animals.

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Science

In science lessons, we will be learning all about the life cycles and what humans and animals need to survive. We will also learn where animals get their food and create simple food chains. We will also discuss healthy eating and the importance of exercise.



music

In Music lessons, we will explore ways to use our voice expressively while singing.



PE

In PE lessons, we will be improving our team building skills and revisiting our fundamental skills.

In PSHE, we are focusing on Rules and Responsibilities to help us remind ourselves of our school expectations and motto.

In Computing, we will be learning how to use our iPads safely and we will also be using Scratch Jr.




Phonics

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## Maths

In maths, we will be diving into the foundations of number and place value through the White Rose Maths curriculum.

Key learning includes:

- 1. Counting forwards and backwards up to 100
- 2. Recognising tens and ones in two-digit numbers
- 3. Reading and writing numbers in numerals and words
- 4. Partitioning numbers in different ways
- 5. Comparing and ordering numbers using place value
- 6. Counting in steps of 2, 5, 10 and 3

Children will use practical resources, pictorial representations, and number lines to deepen their understanding. Reasoning and problem-solving activities will help develop fluency and confidence with numbers.
