

## Year 6 INSPIRE Curriculum Newsletter – Autumn 1


In our history lessons, Year 6 will learn about WW2. We will be visiting the National Memorial Arboretum, where we will reflect on what life was like in Britain during WW2.

Our crucial curriculum content for this topic is:

- To be able to explain what life was like for the people of Britain during World War 2, including the impact of rationing, air raid strikes and evacuation.
- To understand the role Sir Winston Churchill played in motivating the British public at a time when it looked like the war would be lost.
- To describe how the Battle of Dunkirk and the Battle of Britain became significant turning points in the war that would ultimately lead the Allies to victory.











Our key text for this topic is 'Letters from the Lighthouse' by Emma Carroll. We will read the story during class novel time and explore the book in our reading lessons.

In writing lessons, we will continue to develop our use of a wide range of punctuation. We will be writing diary entries and letters in role as WW2 evacuees. We will investigate discussion texts and write our own balanced argument about evacuation in WW2.



In DT lessons, we will investigate
Anderson Shelters and use our
knowledge from our history lessons to
design and make a model Anderson
Shelter. We will investigate different
materials to build a structure and
evaluate our finished product.


