Mountain Ranges: The Andes mountain range runs along the border with Chile.

Major Rivers: The Parana river (4880km long) and the Uruguay river (1838km long).

Landmarks and Other Physical Features:

- Iguazu falls – These are the largest series of waterfalls in the world.
- Pampas – A huge area of flat grassland in the centre of the country.
- Perito Moreno glacier – This glacier is bigger than Buenos Aires.
- Quebrada de Humahuaca – This is a gorge in north-west Argentina. It is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

Climate: Cold, dry winters and hot, humid summers.

Argentina is a country situated in the continent of South America. It covers most of the southern part of the continent. It is also the world's 8th largest country.


Buenos Aires is the capital city of Argentina. It is a multicultural city with a population of nearly 3 million people.
