Can you create an information page to explain how the circulatory system works?</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>PSHE</u></p> <p>Use your knowledge from PSHE lessons to create a poster aimed at Year 6 children which shares information about finances and managing financial pressures from peers.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Science</u></p> <p>Using your knowledge of the human body and the circulatory system, can you create a leaflet aimed at primary school children to encourage them to keep fit and look after their bodies.</p>
