ATTENDANCE

The importance of attendance in school

- The Government regard 95% as the minimum satisfactory attendance for a primary school pupil.
- 95% altendance is the equivalent of 2 weeks off school.
- A 2 week absence each year in primary school means a total of 14 weeks teaching time missed —
 this could have real impact on your child's basic numeracy and literacy skills.
- 90% allendance is like having a day off every two weeks or 4 whole weeks off school
- 80% allendance is the same as having a day off every week.
- Most children should routinely have attendance rates of 97% or more. This is the equivalent of 6 days absence a year. 100% is achieved by many pupils every year in both primary and secondary schools.
- *Holidays in term time These will not be approved by Mrs Forrester and fines may be issued for unauthorised holidays taken in term time (£60 per parent per child)
