The importance of attendance in school

- The Government regard 95% as the minimum satisfactory attendance for a primary school pupil.
- 95% altendance is the equivalent of 2 weeks off school.
- A 2 week absence each year in primary school means a total of 14 weeks teaching time missed this could have real impact on your child's basic numeracy and literacy skills.
- 90% altendance is like having a day off every two weeks or 4 whole weeks off school
- 80% altendance is the same as having a day off every week.
- Most children should routinely have attendance rates of 97% or more. This is the equivalent of 6
 days absence a year. 100% is achieved by many pupils every year in both primary and secondary
 schools.
- Holidays in term time These will not be approved by Mrs Forrester and fines may be issued for unauthorised holidays taken in term time.

Itinerary and bookings Learn about pilgrimage in the past, the Benedictine monks, St Werburgh, how the cathedral is used today, the sounds of the Grand


