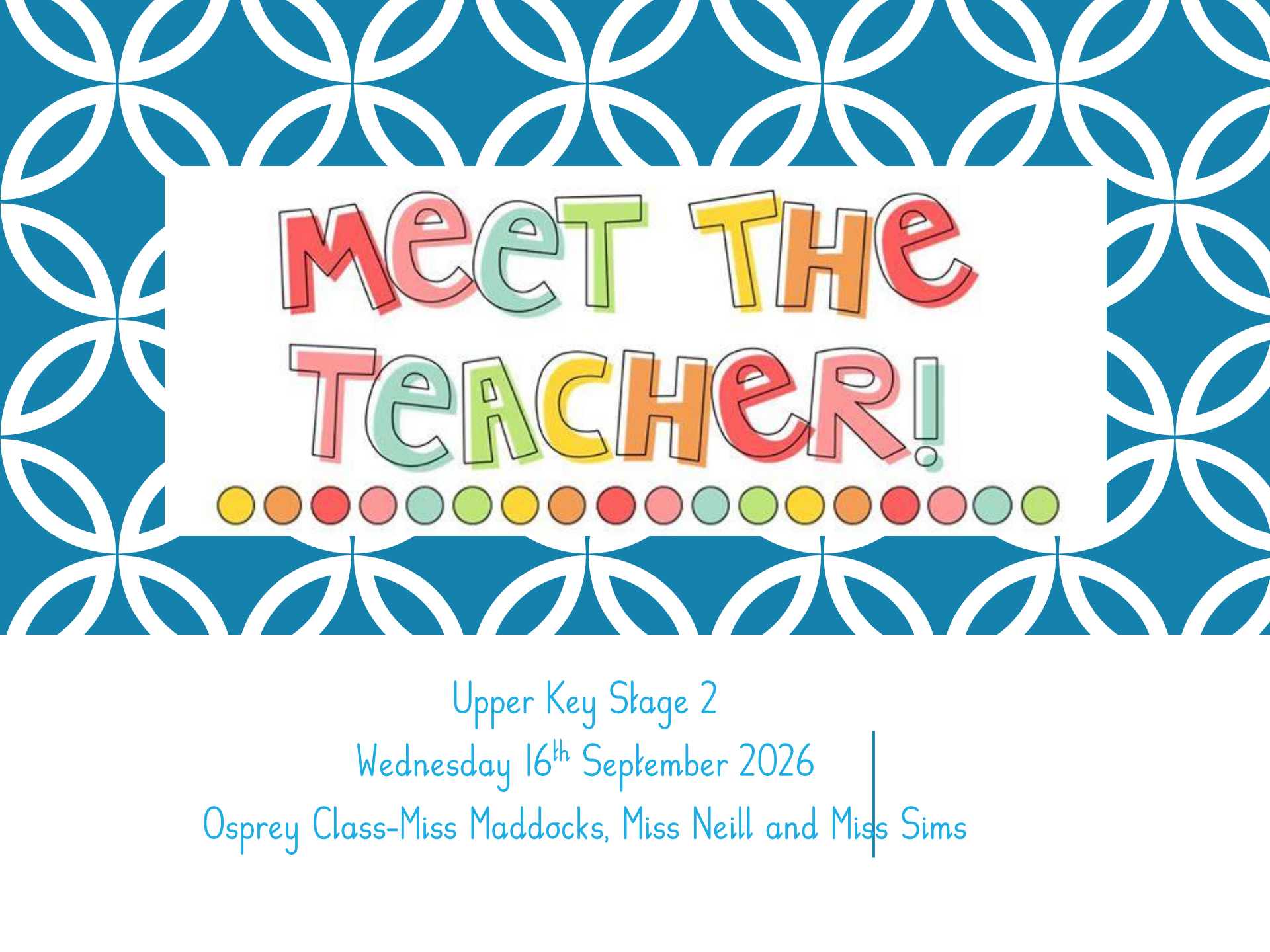
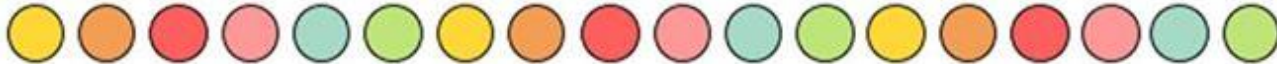

School Uniform-

PE and Games

- For indoor lessons - black / navy shorts at least mid thigh length (no hot pants), red PE t-shirts, black pumps or dark coloured trainers.
- For outdoor lessons - black / navy shorts – at least mid thigh length (no hot pants), red PE t-shirts, black pumps or dark coloured trainers.



- For outdoor lessons during cold weather - dark coloured track suit bottoms and school jumper may be worn.
- Pupils with long hair should have it securely tied back for all PE lessons.
- In the interests of safety, stud ear rings are the only acceptable type during PE/Games lessons and should be removed or covered with sticking plaster.

*Please note - Mouthguards and shin pads must be worn for hockey club and hockey competitions. Football boots and shin pads must be worn for football club and football competitions.

8. Hair, Jewellery and Appearance

To ensure safety, equality and readiness to learn:

- Hair should be neat and tidy; long hair must be tied back
- Hair should be appropriate for school, taking into account health, safety and suitability for learning. Reasonable adjustments will be made where required
- Hair accessories should be plain and discreet in school or neutral colours
- No make-up or nail varnish
- Jewellery limited to:
 - One watch (no smart watches)
 - One pair of small stud earrings

Items unable to be worn safely may need to be removed for certain activities.

School starts at 8:45am and ends at 3:20pm.

The importance of attendance in school

- *The Government regard 95% as the minimum satisfactory attendance for a primary school pupil.*
- *95% attendance is the equivalent of 2 weeks off school.*
- *A 2 week absence each year in primary school means a total of 14 weeks teaching time missed — this could have real impact on your child's basic numeracy and literacy skills.*
- *90% attendance is like having a day off every two weeks or 4 whole weeks off school*
- *80% attendance is the same as having a day off every week.*
- *Most children should routinely have attendance rates of 97% or more. This is the equivalent of 6 days absence a year. 100% is achieved by many pupils every year in both primary and secondary schools.*
- *Holidays in term time — These will not be approved by Mrs Forrester and fines may be issued for unauthorised holidays taken in term time.*

SCHOOL MEALS - LUNCH ORDERING

HOMEWORK

- Homework set on a Friday and to be completed by the following Wednesday
- Homework diaries to be brought in daily as they are also our reading diaries (x3 reads a week)
- Children should aim to complete 2-3 school reading books per half term.
- Homework club on a Wednesday lunchtime
- Reading every day at home — ideally with an adult
- Bring homework diary into school daily
- SPAG or reading comprehension via Atom Learning
- Maths on a weekly basis via Magma Maths
- Due on Wednesday, set on Friday
- Optional menu of activities — Burger Menu
- Spellings will no longer be set and tested weekly.
- IDL will primarily be a home based activity where you can support your child's spelling.

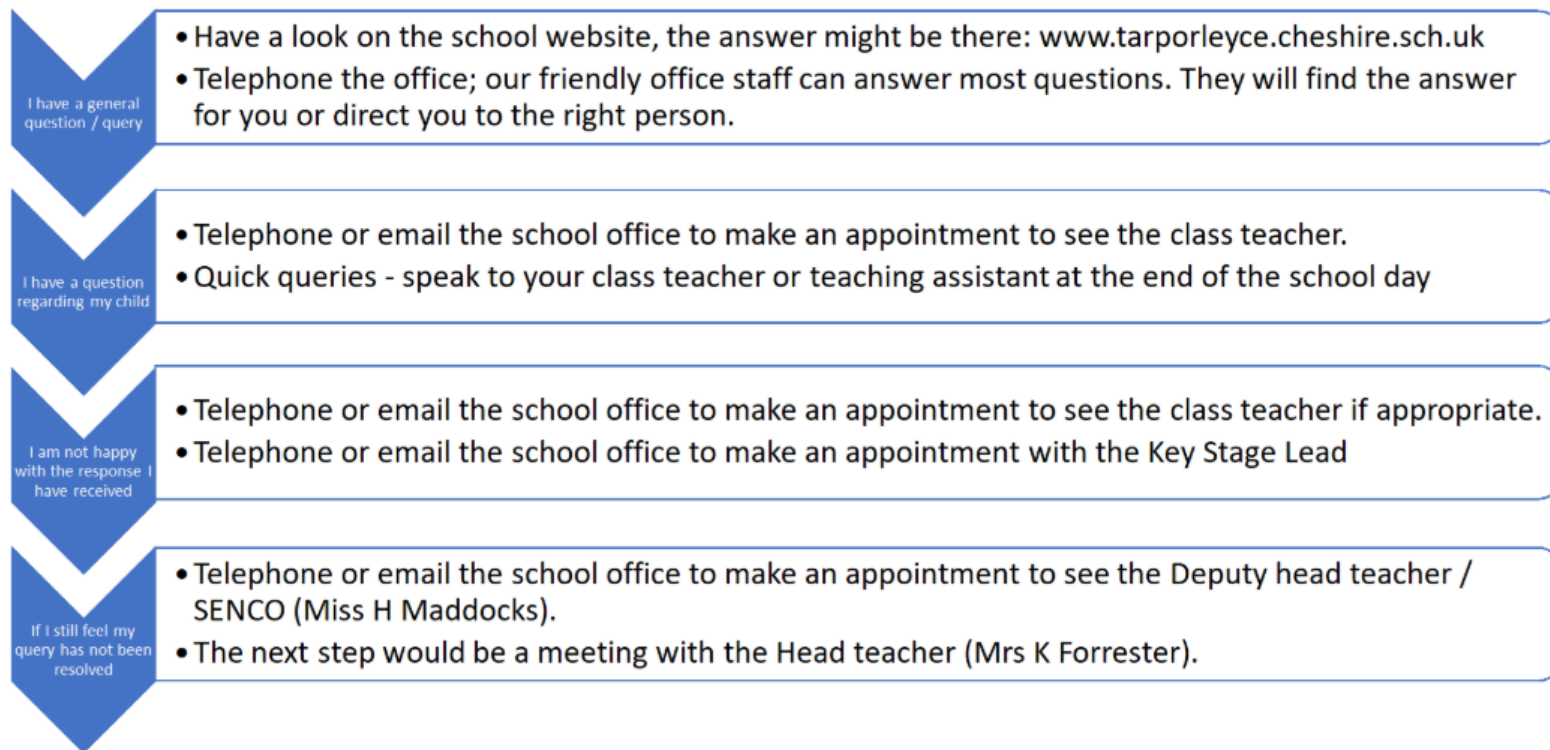
