Our Autumn Learning

Subject	Key Learning
Reading	Autumn I: Hidden Figures - This reading-focused unit, based on <i>Hidden Figures: The True Story of Four Black Women and the Space Race</i> by Margot Lee Shetterly and Winifred Conkling, supports pupils in developing a deep understanding of a nonfiction text while enhancing their comprehension, critical thinking, and discussion skills.

Reading and Comprehension Journey:

Through an engaging and knowledge-rich approach, children explore the remarkable true story of four African-American women whose mathematical talents helped launch NASA's space missions. This powerful narrative forms the foundation for rich reading outcomes that focus on both literal understanding and higher-order comprehension skills.

Autumn 2: Cogheart - In this unit, children explore the rich and imaginative world of *Cogheart*, a steampunk adventure filled with mystery, danger, and emotion. Through this novel study, pupils are supported to develop sophisticated reading comprehension skills, including inference, prediction, authorial intent, and thematic analysis.

Reading and Comprehension Journey:

This text-driven unit provides pupils with opportunities to engage in deep discussion, close reading, and critical thinking, all while immersed in a gripping narrative that explores themes such as loss, courage, and the nature of humanity.

Autumn I: The man who walked between the towers - In this unit, based on Mordicai Gerstein's *The Man Who Walked Between the Towers*, the primary writing outcome is for children to write a well-structured and engaging biography of Philippe Petit, the high-wire artist who famously walked between the Twin Towers in 1974.

Learning Journey and Build-Up to the Outcome:

Writing

Throughout the unit, children engage in a carefully structured sequence of lessons designed to immerse them in the context of the story, develop key literacy skills, and deepen their understanding of biographical writing.

Autumn 2: Main Writing Outcome: Writing a Fiction Narrative

	In this unit, based on Malorie Blackman's Robot Girl, the main writing outcome is for children to craft an original fiction narrative, drawing on themes of identity, secrecy, and the ethical implications of artificial intelligence. Learning Journey and Build-Up to the Outcome: This unit takes children on a thought-provoking journey that explores both the emotional depth and moral dilemmas presented in the story. Through a series of carefully sequenced lessons, pupils develop the skills needed to plan, write, and edit a compelling narrative of their own.
