As we reach the end of our first Autumn term, I would like to thank all our wonderful children and staff for making our school the special place it is. This is, of course, only possible with the ongoing support of our parents and carers, governors, PTA, community and Trust colleagues.

Our five classes have enjoyed a range of rich learning opportunities this half term:

## ROBINS

During Autumn 2, the Robins have continued to grow in confidence as they explored their learning through stories, seasonal activities and play. The children have developed their independence, built strong friendships and shown great enthusiasm across all areas of the curriculum. They especially enjoyed performing our Christmas play for parents and carers—and made us all very proud.

## WRENS

Wrens have been very busy across the curriculum this half term. In English, we made and tasted porridge just like Goldilocks, and wrote letters to the Three Bears. In Maths, we explored 2D and 3D shapes and had great fun creating our own models. In Geography, we learned about human and physical features. In RE, we enjoyed exploring the Nativity story, which we shared as our Christmas performance. In DT, we designed and made our own moving vehicles.

## GOLDFINCHES

The Goldfinches have been inspired by the book *Winter's Child* by Angela McAllister this half term. They used the narrative to create persuasive discussions about why winter should last forever. They also thoroughly enjoyed their visit to the Liverpool World Museum and their Ancient Greece workshop—where they even had the chance to try on helmets and shields!

## STARLINGS

This term, Starlings have been reading Ted Hughes' *The Iron Man*. They created a life-size model using recycled boxes, now proudly displayed in our hall. They also visited the World Museum as part of our History curriculum and took part in an Ancient Greece workshop. It was a fantastic day, and the children loved exploring the entire museum.

## OWLS

The Owl Class have also been busy! They've been writing inspiring speeches for the Aspire Speech Festival and exploring topics such as global foods, sustainability and how migration shapes what we eat. To bring learning to life, the children prepared a delicious three-course meal featuring leek and potato soup, homemade pizza and traditional German biscuits—all while applying their understanding of fractions in a practical and meaningful way.

<b><u>Breakfast Club/ After School Club</u></b>	We would like to remind parents/carers that paid breakfast club opens from 8am. <b>The free breakfast club runs from 8.15am to 8.45am.</b> After school club runs until 4.15pm or 6pm.  Sessions for the Breakfast Club & After School Club must be booked in advance and any due payments paid for prior to the sessions. Please ring the bell by the front office labelled breakfast and after school club when dropping off for the paid breakfast club and collecting from the paid after school club.
<b><u>School start time</u></b>	We would like to clarify that the school gate opens at 8:40am for Robins children and 8:45am for Wrens, Goldfinches, Starlings & Owls. The school gate closes at 8:55am. Anyone arriving later than 8.55am will need to bring their child/children in via the school office and sign them in.
<b><u>School finish time</u></b>	The school gates will open around 3.05pm for parents/carers to enter onto the playground. At 3.10pm the Robins children can be collected from their teacher in their outdoor area. At 3.15pm Wrens can be collected from their teacher via the porch area of the main playground and the Goldfinches, Starlings & Owls will come out to meet parents/carers through the door near the kitchen and wait with their teacher. The school gate closes at 3.20pm as we have outdoor clubs running some evenings. Anyone arriving after the gates have closed will need to collect their child via the front office.
<b><u>Leave of absence requests</u></b>	All applications for holidays/ special circumstances must be made in writing on our leave of absence request form and must be forwarded to the school office. <b><u>Year 7 High School Places September 2026</u></b>	Notification of offers will be communicated on 2 <sup>nd</sup> March 2026 by Cheshire West & Chester (not the school). These can be accessed via parents/carers online application account and also sent via email. The closing date for appeals is 30 <sup>th</sup> March 2026. Any appeals made before the closing date will be heard before 16 <sup>th</sup> June 2026.
