Headteachers Message:

What a wonderfully busy half-term it has been for our school community! From exciting educational trips that have brought learning to life, to the hard work and dedication shown by our pupils during the KS2 assessments, it has certainly been a full and rewarding few weeks. We have also enjoyed coming together for our non-uniform days, which always help to raise both funds and spirits across the school. A particular highlight has been welcoming our new Reception children for September 2026/27—they have already made such a positive impression, and we are very much looking forward to them joining us as part of our school family.

Our five classes want to share some of their experiences with you:

Robins

This term, the Robins went on our first school trip to Peak Wildlife, where we learned about animals and nature. We also planted seeds to grow our own vegetables and flowers, which was exciting and helped make our outdoor area more colourful and lively.



Wrens

This half term, Wrens have been learning all about how to look after a Bog Baby and have enjoyed writing instructions explaining how to care for one properly. As part of our hook lesson, we also had great fun trying to teach Ms Tatler and Miss Breau how to make a jam sandwich — although it did not go quite to plan!

In Maths, we have been learning to tell the time using o'clock and half past, while Year 2 have also been exploring quarter past and quarter to.

Year 1 have also been working incredibly hard in Phonics, practising lots of real and alien words as they prepare for their Phonics Screening Check in June.

History has been very exciting as we have been learning about significant people from Northwich and discovered lots of interesting facts about Joseph Verdin and Frank Roberts.

We have been preparing for Sports Day by practising our running, throwing, jumping and balancing skills in PE.



Goldfinches

This half-term, our learning has been full of creativity and curiosity across the curriculum. In science, we have been exploring different materials and investigating which ones act as conductors, developing our understanding through hands-on experiments. In design and technology, the children have applied their problem-solving skills brilliantly by designing and creating their own moving monsters, using pneumatic systems to bring their ideas to life. In English, we have continued to build our confidence as writers and speakers, with a particular focus on widening our vocabulary and using ambitious language in our work. It has been fantastic to see the children's enthusiasm and progress in all areas.



Starlings

Have enjoyed reading the book - Turtle Moon. They created their own turtles from pipe cleaners and then wrote their own adventure stories based on the book. They then researched Loggerhead Turtles to help them write a non-chronological report.

Year 5 took part in Northwich Sings, performing 10 songs on stage at The Northwich Memorial Hall - they all did amazingly well.

Year 4 have also been enjoying their music lessons - learning the pieces of music they will perform with the Halle orchestra at the Bridgewater Hall in June.



Owls

Year 6 have had a busy and productive half term, with a strong focus on preparing for the KS2 assessments. We have been working hard to secure our number skills in maths, develop our reading comprehension and strengthen our grammar knowledge. In English, we have enjoyed writing in role based on the poem The Lion and Albert, exploring the use of northern dialect and character voice. In Science, we have been learning about classifying animals and plants, whilst also taking some time to relax and be creative through art activities. We have recently started our swimming sessions and are already building confidence in the water. We are now looking forward to all the exciting opportunities in Summer 2 including our trip to London, end of year production and visits to our high schools.

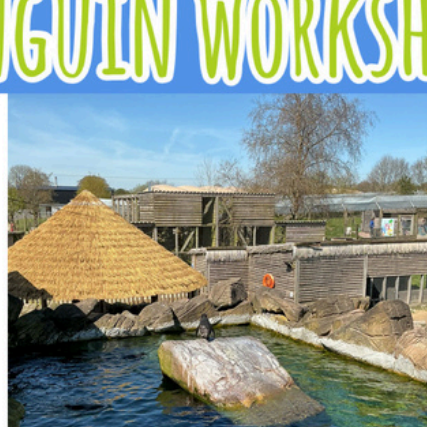

Every Day Matters

Missing school affects your child's learning and development. Currently, 23.38% of our pupils are classified as persistently absent (missing 10% or more of school) which is significantly higher than national at 18.62%.

Even a few days here and there can quickly add up and impact your child's progress.

96% or Above

85 Children achieved 96% or above this term, with 62 achieving 100% attendance. Well done!

Most Improved Attendance

Almost all classes have improved overall attendance this term. However congratulations to Owls for the most improved class!

Punctuality

Regular, small amounts of daily lateness add up to a significant amount of lost education over an academic year.
