SEND REVIEW

As you are likely aware, I have led SEND provision at Mayfield for many years and periodically we review our work through inviting and collating views in order to determine what we do well and what we could do next to make things better. I have written some thoughts below and on the next two attached pages you will find a headline summary of the findings and responses.

Special educational needs and disabilities is always a busy and demanding aspect of school life, and never more so than in the current climate. At Mayfield our commitment remains the same: to do our very best for every pupil and we are very proud of our offer to families. I am fortunate that school leaders and governors have allowed me to be innovative in shaping our provision to meet the needs of pupils and adapt it as new requirements emerge and needs change and develop. One size fits all is never going to be the way we work at Mayfield and teachers make numerous adaptations to work to enable children to succeed.

This year we have embarked on a sensory curriculum journey for some of our youngest children, which is enabling them to show progress in very small steps. We have now taken the same approach for other pupils whose learning journey is less straightforward and this looks very positive.

Our school continues to work closely with a range of external agencies - including health service, speech and language therapy, and other more specialist teams and I am proud of the reputation our inclusion work has with these colleagues.

I genuinely appreciate the time taken by our parents of children with special educational needs and disabilities. They have shared their views and this always forms an important basis for myself and the team in school to determine what we need to do next. What we always like to do is summarise the key messages but also take the chance to contact individual families as required to discuss some next steps and thoughts. We will be doing this in the coming days after the release of this review. Take a look at the summary on the pages to come.
