Many thanks to everyone who has taken part in our most recent consultation, huge numbers offered us feedback on a range of central questions and also offered thoughts, ideas and opportunities beyond this. As a working group, we have digested the outcomes and wanted to feed this back to everyone over the next two editions of our newsletter.

A reminder that our group consists of myself (Mr Denton) and our parent based governor team of Gemma Clark, Catherine Weir and Leanne Varley.

Firstly, as you will see above, a good number of families expressed interest in being contacted about a new Parent Forum/Fund Raising Group through 'coffee morning' style events. We are contacting each family who expressed interest but are advertising the event to everyone. The first meeting will be Tuesday 3rd March at 9.00am. Two families stated that they would like to attend but can only do the late teatime early evening slot, sadly the overwhelming majority can do the earliest time slot but not the late ones so we have had to go with the earlier time. We will contact those families and ask how we can keep them in the loop and remain in contact via this Mayfield Together forum. It is hard to accommodate all requests but we will try and keep everyone in the communication chain. We understand that work commitments do make any attendance difficult or limit availability.

So, the responses to our questions. You will see on the attached page that this has been an overwhelming positive set of responses. We are going to go through the areas we want to focus on and develop in our next edition, but today we want to highlight some of the major positives. Key questions that any school should look for is around families being pleased that their child attends their school and that they would recommend it. From the extensive number of responses, 100% of families agree or strongly agree with this. Approaching with concerns is equally strong and of almost equal strength are the key questions relating to the children feeling happy and safe. Those are always initial ones that any school should be drawn towards as headlines and then we drill down into the other questions from there.

Each of the remaining areas show similar strong trends of agreement and even the areas of 'not sure'/'don't know' are extremely low in number. Where we have any follow up questions and want to understand more about individual thoughts and perspective we have begun the process of talking to families. Even though this process has produced highly encouraging viewpoints, we want to know where things can improve and look at ideas from here.

In the next edition, we will focus upon responses and thoughts in the second half of the review and look at some steps we are going to take based upon feedback.
