What will I be learning?

We will share how we celebrate special occasions with our family and friends including birthdays and Christmas. We will learn about different festivals around the world including Diwali and Hannukah and we will compare how the events are celebrated. In maths we will explore and discuss different ways numbers are composed and compare the quantities. We will notice patterns in nature and around us on clothing and in the home. We will copy and complete repeating patterns. In phonics we will continue to learn the grapheme phoneme correspondence and digraphs (sh, ch, th, ng, nk) whilst applying them to read words and captions. We will practise forming letters and using them when writing our name, segmenting to write words and captions. We will use our phonic knowledge to read and write lists for example a rhyming list and shopping list. We will learn that everyone is different and will respect and celebrate these differences. We will discuss what makes a good friend and the importance of using kind, positive words and actions.
