BUILDING AN ARMY OF READERS



Please support your child to read at home. Children who read frequently find out about what they like and do not like to read, begin to understand which authors interest them and develop their vocabulary and language skills. It is proven that children who read and are exposed to a wide range of text have success in their later life.

Record their reading at least three times per week to be rewarded for their efforts and help to develop your

child as a confident reader.

25 weeks - Colonel




Our lion cub will be designed and decorated by our school children, and will find its forever home with us at the close of the trail.

This week we have raised a staggering £222






Look out for your child's Book Token in their school bag in the next few weeks.
