
English

In English we are reading Stone Age Boy, written by Satoshi Kitamura, alongside Stig of the Dump, written by Clive King. Our non-fiction text will be Secrets of Stonehenge.

There will be lots of different writing opportunities including an adventure narrative, information texts and diary entries. We also have a daily shared reading or Phonics session, during which we will look at a different extract each week (fiction, non-fiction or poetry) to develop our reading skills.







Maths

This half term in Maths No Problem! we will be focusing on Numbers to 1000. This will include sequencing numbers, identifying numbers greater than or less than and becoming familiar with mathematical terminology.

We will move on to Addition and Subtraction before the end of this half term.





Computing

Children will describe what a good 'digital citizen' looks like. They will able to identify whether information online is reliable and be able to identify what types of personal information should never be shared online. Children will also be supported to recognise potential scams online.



P.E.

We will be performing basic **dance** actions with understanding of mood and feeling in the response to music. We will be choosing appropriate movements to create short phrases. We will also be exploring invasion games

PE will take place every **Friday** afternoon.



R.E.

In R.E we are asking the question: Why is the Bible important for Christians Our PSHE topic this half term is Being Me In My World. We will be asking today? This unit is part of the Believing strand of our agreed Liverpool RE syllabus. The children will look at the sacred texts linked to different religions. Stories and parables from these texts will eb shared with the children.
