The information on this sheet will give you a brief overview of some of the activities we will be doing this half-term across the curriculum. Please feel free to contact your child's class teacher if you have any questions, or can offer any support.

English

Our main English text this half term will be 'Vlad and the Great Fire of London'

We will also be beginning quided reading sessions to help improve the children's skill in identifying key words to support them in locating facts and information in a text, as well as continuing with Phonics. We will be working on the children's inference skills and ability to generalise about a whole text.

Within in English lessons, we will continue to develop their handwriting; focusing on the correct formation of letters and building fine motor control.



P.E.

This half term, we will be exploring invasion games and learning the principles of defending and attacking. The children will use and develop skills such as sending and receiving with both feet and hands, as well as dribbling with both feet and hands. The children will have the opportunity to play uneven and even sided games. PE will take place every **Monday** this half-term.
