The information on this sheet will give you a brief overview of some of the activities we will be doing this half-term across the curriculum. Please feel free to contact your child's class teacher if you have any questions, or can offer any support.

#### English

#### 'Flotsam' by David Wiesner

During the Spring term we will be looking at a new and exciting book, 'Flotsam'. The This half term in Maths No Problem! we will be focusing on Multiplication and Division | Children will learn the importance of how to use technology purposefully to store and story will allow us to explore new vocabulary and a variety of writing genres. We will plan and write a narrative using speech, con junctions and synonyms.

For our non-fiction text, we will be reading 'Water Cycle' written M. Rose. We will be We will also practice solving word problems related to multiplication and division. discussing the features of non-fiction text, culminating with the children writing their own explanation text.

We will also be looking at shape poetry and calligrams.

We have a daily Shared Reading or Phonics session, during which we will look at a different extract each week (fiction, non-fiction or poetry) and develop our reading skills.

We continue to practise cursive letter formation and spelling every day.

We have a 'Maths Basic Skills' session every day which will include skills linked to our lessons, as well as arithmetic and times tables practice.
