### Why Does Attendance Matter?

Attending school means so much more than learning to read, write and count. When we regularly attend school we develop our social skills, like making friends and resolving conflict. We learn to build life skills such as resilience and responsibility.

We also gain a sense of belonging.

Children who attend school regularly are more likely to experience greater academic success, less mental and physical health problems and better life chances.

As soon as your child starts school, every day they are absent can potentially impact upon their future.

If a child has 90% attendance over the school year, this is the same as having

1/2 a day off each week 19 days off a year

If a child has 85% attendance this means they have learnt around 250 lessons

Every child has the right to an education. Let's work together to make sure this happens.

Safe Streets Around Our School

At our school, keeping our children safe is always our top priority — and that includes the streets around our site. We're asking for everyone's help to make drop-off and pick-up times safer and calmer for all.

Please consider our neighbours and community when parking near school. Avoid parking on kerbs, grass verges, or across driveways — this helps keep pavements clear for children, prams, and wheelchair users.

Let's reduce congestion near school gates. We're especially asking families not to park on Trouville Road or around the main rear playground gate, and not to park on the central reservation of Pinehurst Avenue.

Why not park five minutes away and walk the rest of the way? It's healthier, safer, and helps ease traffic for everyone.

Thank you for your continued support in making our streets safer for all. We're proud to be working closely with Liverpool City Council, our local councillors, the Highways team, and the Safer Streets initiative to improve safety around our school.
